Important IRS Information for MaineCare Providers

Your MaineCare payments may be affected if IRS and MIHMS information do not match.

The Taxpayer Identification Number Matching Program is established under the authority of Revenue Procedure 2003-9. Under this provision, MaineCare is required by law to report to the IRS your business name, Tax Identification Number (TIN), total payments, and any tax withholding every year.

Your **name and/or business name, tax identification number (TIN) and TIN type, i.e., Social Security Number (SSN) or Employer ID Number (EIN)**, as enrolled with MaineCare, needs to match what is on file with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

If the information in MIHMS and at the IRS does not match, MaineCare will stop your payments until the error is fixed. To keep payments flowing, please check your MIHMS and IRS records and fix any errors **as soon as possible**.

You can find your IRS name and TIN on items from the IRS such as income tax returns, payroll deposit coupons or similar forms to verify the name and TIN that the IRS has on file for your entity. You can also contact the IRS at 1-800-829-3676 or www.irs.gov for this information.

Compare this to the name and TIN you used to enroll in MIHMS (Maine Integrated Health Management Solution).

If you enrolled with an SSN in MIHMS, your tax form must list your SSN. If you used an EIN in MIHMS, your tax forms must list your EIN.
